Are you a Computer Professional interested in migrating to Australia?

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An essential requirement in a visa application under the Australian Skilled Migration is obtaining a suitable skills assessment for your nominated occupation from the relevant skills assessing authority authorised by the Department of Immigration and Citizenship. The relevant skills assessing authority for computer professionals is the Australian Computer Society (ACS).

What do you need in order to pass the Skills Assessment?

The ACS refers to the *Country Educational Profile* (CEP) of the country of your education in comparing overseas qualifications with qualifications in the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF). The CEP relates only to the educational level of the qualification, not to the field of study of Computer Professionals.

There are three pathways for an overseas qualified applicant to obtain a suitable skills assessment. You need to satisfy only one of the following:

1. Your educational qualification is comparable to an Australian Bachelor degree, Graduate Diploma, or higher qualification, with a <u>major</u> in Information Communication Technology (ICT) and you have at least four (4) equivalent years of full-time relevant ICT work experience, at the professional level.

2. Your educational qualification is comparable to an Australian AQF diploma, an Australian AQF advanced diploma with a <u>major</u> in ICT, or an Australian bachelor degree, or graduate diploma, or higher qualification with a <u>minor (sub-major)</u> in ICT <u>and you have at least six (6)</u> equivalent years of full-time relevant ICT experience, at the professional level.

3. Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)- you have considerable ICT work experience at professional-level and informal study or training in courses conducted by educational or ICT industry based organisations even if you do not hold an educational qualification that is comparable to an Australian Bachelors degree or diploma in ICT as required by the first two pathways discussed above <u>and</u> minimum six years relevant ICT work experience. ACS will determine your qualification and experience, on a case-to-case basis.

Evidence of your studies in certain core subjects will be considered. If the outcome of your skills assessment is suitable for migration purposes, you may submit the ACS letter with your visa application without completing any further study. However there are other requirements for your visa application to succeed, such as evidence of English skills, recent work experience, health and character tests, in addition to passing the points test, among others.
