## **Changes to General Skilled Migration from 1 September 2007**

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Changes to the General Skilled Migration (GSM) programme which were recommended by the DIAC commissioned Evaluation Committee will take effect from 1 September 2007 rather than from 1 July 2007. Visa applicants who shall make an application for a skilled visa on or before 31 August 2007 will not be affected by the changes.

#### The main changes to GSM include:

- an increase in the English language threshold for GSM visa applicants

  The threshold level of English language proficiency will be raised from a IELTS passmark of 5 (vocational) to 6 (competent) on all four components.

  However, the passmark for applicants for trade occupations will remain at the current threshold of an IELTS score of 5.
- reward for GSM visa applicants who have very good English language proficiency Under the points test system, applicants who achieve English language scores above the threshold level, i.e. have scored a minimum of 7.0 in each of the four components, will be entitled to 25 points.

### - introduction of a new temporary work visa for graduates

International students who are unable to meet the new requirements for a permanent skilled visa will have an opportunity to apply for an 18 month Skilled-Graduate (subclass 485) to build on their skills and work experience. This visa will have unrestricted work rights and will therefore allow overseas students to gain skilled experience, improve their English skills or undertake a professional year of occupational training after completion of course requirements before applying for a General Skilled Migration visa. The changes aim to ensure that overseas students who decide to stay on in Australia after completing their studies have a much better chance of competing for jobs in their chosen occupation.

#### - a simplification of the GSM visa structure

There are currently 15 GSM visa subclasses available to people onshore and offshore, who are wishing to apply to migrate to Australia. Under the new visa structure, this will be reduced to nine visa subclasses - four offshore and five onshore. This new structure aims to enables applicants to more easily identify the visa subclass best suited to their circumstances.

#### greater emphasis on skilled work experience.

To ensure skilled migrants have the skills Australian employers need, there will be closer links between study, work experience and nominated occupation. Thus, additional points will be allocated for 12 months skilled work experience in Australia instead of the previously 6 months requirement.

# In addition the same period of work experience can be used to claim entitlement to points for Australian work experience, specific work experience and MODL.

Thus, if the applicant has worked in a MODL occupation is Australia for at least 12 month, points for both MODL and Australian work experience may be claimed and if the applicant has worked for in the MODL occupation for at least three years, he or she can also be entitled to specific work experience points.

The following table is our understanding of the points test application from 1 September 2007.
